FOREWORD

Partners in Purchase existed as one of the Illinois Arts Council's unique and innovative programs for 11 years. From 1976 until 1987, the program provided matching funds to Illinois non-profit institutions including museums, art centers, colleges and universities and libraries to purchase completed works of living Illinois visual or media artists. The program encouraged institutions to expand their collections of contemporary art and provided a stimulating marketplace for Illinois artists. In its 11 years over 500 works of art by 350 different artists were acquired by 65 institutions throughout the state.

The Illinois Arts Council, a state agency, acts as a catalyst in promoting the continued vitality of the arts in Illinois. The P.I.P. program was conceived largely by Chicago artist and curator Don Baum in 1965. Baum recognized that Illinois artists were, for the most part, being overlooked by galleries and collectors in the Chicago area. The impact of the program on the recent art history of Illinois is a cumulative one. It enabled the expansion of institutional collections and encouraged the careers of artists throughout the state. With the emergence of the program and several experimental galleries in Chicago, and with the rise of the *Hairy Who* and the *Imagist Movement*, Illinois artists began receiving the exposure they so richly deserved. The program served not only to recognize the careers of such now-established artists as Phyllis Bramson, Richard Hunt, Ed Paschke, Gladys Nilsson and Karl Wirsum, but also introduced new artists including James Butler, John Henry, Harold Gregor, Jerry Peart and James Winn to the people of Illinois.

Institutions were able to purchase original paintings, sculptures, photographs, prints, crafts, ethnic/folk art, drawings and films and video art. P.I.P. applications were reviewed by a panel of qualified artists and curators. Awards were made on the basis of the quality of the work proposed and the ability of the applicant organizations to insure, maintain and properly display their acquisitions for the public benefit.

The exhibition *Partners in Purchase: Selected Works 1976-1987* surveys a representative sample of the work collected by Illinois institutions during the course of the program. The scope of the exhibition was naturally limited by the available space at the State of Illinois Art Gallery and the organizing institution, Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences. Within those limitations, I am hopeful that the resulting selection of 85 works does justice to the good work of the Illinois Arts Council and the artists of our state.

The successful execution of this project depended on the efforts of many individuals and organizations. I am most indebted to the Illinois Arts Council for funding the exhibition and this publication. I am particularly grateful to Alan J. Leder, director, Visual Arts Programs, and Robert Hornsby, curator of the Illinois Arts Council. Both were extremely cooperative and helpful from the exhibition's inception to its realization. I appreciate the willingness of Debora Duez Donato, administrator of the State of Illinois Art Gallery, and her staff for making the exhibition available to a greater-Chicago area audience. Mindy Faber, associate

director of the Video Bank at The Art Institute of Chicago, and Barbara Scharres, director of the Film Center at The School of The Art Institute, were kind to lend their facilities and expertise in selecting the films and videos that are included in the exhibition. Tom Van Eynde, Forest Park, provided the color transparencies and black and white photographs that were used for reproduction in this publication, and Dana Sireno-Krypel Photography, Evanston, photographed a majority fo the video reproductions used herein. I am also grateful to Shirley Bowe of Feldman Printing, Peoria, for her creative energies in the design of this catalogue and to Terry Feldman for his printing expertise. Thanks are also due the staff of Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences for their cooperation — particularly Gloria Dearborn for her secretarial assistance, John Heintzman for attending to the registrar's details and Cory Tibbits for the design and installation of the exhibition in Peoria. Finally, I am most grateful to the artists for their creations and to the many institutions throughout Illinois that were willing to lend the works of art they acquired through the Partners in Purchase program.

To everyone involved in *Partners in Purchase: Selected Works 1976-1987*, I extend a warm and sincere thank you.
